DESCRIPTION

Sikaflex[®]-211 EN is a general polyurethane sealant that cures on exposure to atmospheric moisture. It bonds well to a wide variety of substrates. It is designed for interior sealing applications.

AREAS OF APPLICATION

Sikaflex[®]-211 EN bonds well to a wide variety of substrates and is suitable for making permanent elastic seals. Suitable substrate materials are timber, metals, metal primers, paint coatings (2-C systems) and ceramic materials.

Seek manufacturer's advice and perform tests on original substrates before using Sikaflex®-211 EN on materials prone to stress cracking. This product is suitable for experienced professional users only. Tests with actual substrates and conditions have to be performed ensuring adhesion and material compatibility.

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CURE MECHANISM

Sikaflex[®]-211 EN cures by reaction with atmospheric moisture. At low temperatures the water content of the air is generally lower and the curing reaction proceeds somewhat slower (see diagram 1).




Diagram 1: Curing speed Sikaflex®-211 EN

CHEMICAL RESISTANCE

Sikaflex®-211 EN is generally resistant to fresh water, seawater, diluted acids and diluted caustic solutions; temporarily resistant to fuels, mineral oils, vegetable and animal fats and oils; not resistant to organic acids, glycolic alcohol, concentrated mineral acids and caustic solutions or solvents.

METHOD OF APPLICATION

Surface Preparation

Surfaces must be clean, dry and free from grease, oil, dust and contaminants.

Surface treatment depends on the specific nature of the substrates and is crucial for a long lasting bond. Suggestions for surface preparation may be found on the current edition of the appropriate Sika[®] Pre-Treatment Chart. Consider that these suggestions are based on experience and have in any case to be verified by tests on original substrates.

Application

Sikaflex[®]-211 EN can be processed between 5 °C and 40 °C (climate and product) but changes in reactivity and application properties have to be considered. The optimum temperature for substrate and process material is between 15 °C and 25 °C.

Sikaflex[®]-211 EN can be processed with manual, pneumatic or electric driven piston guns.

Tooling and Finishing

Tooling and finishing must be carried out within the skin time of the product. It is recommended using Sika[®] Tooling Agent N. Other finishing agents must be tested for suitability and compatibility prior the use.

Removal

Uncured Sikaflex[®]-211 EN may be removed from tools and equipment with Sika[®] Remover-208 or another suitable solvent. Once cured, the material can only be removed mechanically.

Hands and exposed skin have to be washed immediately using hand wipes such as Sika[®] Cleaner-350H or a suitable industrial hand cleaner and water.

Do not use solvents on skin.

Overpainting

Sikaflex®-211 EN can be painted after formation of a skin. If the paint requires a baking process, best performance is achieved by allowing the sealant to fully cure first. 1C-PUR and 2C-acrylic based paints are usually suitable. All paints have to be tested by carrying preliminary trials under manufacturing conditions.

The elasticity of paints is usually lower than that of sealants. This could lead to cracking of the paint in the joint area.
